

- 1. Scholarships must be used for tuition and related educational expenses approved by the Miss Idaho Board of Directors.
- 2. To request an awarded scholarship, Candidates must provide a statement or invoice from their college or university. This statement or invoice must be accompanied by the request for disbursement form. All scholarship payments must be made directly to your college or university. The Miss Idaho Scholarship Program is not able to reimburse Candidates or their families directly. Please submit your request at least 6 weeks prior to the date payment is due.
- 3. Candidates must use the scholarships won at the local level prior to applying for state scholarships.

 Candidates must submit a letter from the local pageant director which verifies the previous statement.
- 4. Scholarships may be used for current educational expenses. Candidates may not request payment or reimbursement for expenses which are or have been covered through any other financial aid source, other than student loans which meet the provisions of paragraph #6 below. Scholarships may also be used to pay for "on campus" house and meal plans.
- 5. If you choose to drop courses, a course is cancelled, or you cancel enrollment the scholarship sent to your institution will be returned directly to the Miss Idaho Scholarship Program and will remain in your account as outlined in paragraph #8 below.
- 6. Scholarships may be used for the outstanding student loan obligations provided the loan is not in default and provided the student has satisfactory complete the coursework for which the loan was obtained. Candidates must submit documentation from the school or lender which shows that the Candidate is either the primary or secondary payer of the loan obligation. Notice of payment due should be sent to Miss Idaho Scholarship Program at missidahoboard@gmail.com.
- 7. Scholarships may be used for future educational expenses. Candidates must begin use of their scholarship within one year (2 years for Miss Idaho) of the date awarded. If a Candidate has no activity in her scholarship account during this period the funds in her account will automatically be forfeited. If a Candidate does not have any activity in her scholarship account for a period of one year, the funds in her account will be forfeited.
- 8. A ONE TIME exception to the time limits described above may be made if the Candidate, prior to the expiration date, submits the scholarship deferment request form citing compelling reasons why the time period should be extended. The Board of Directors will review the request and determine whether or not an extended time period is warranted. The decision of the Board of Directors is final and binding.
- 9. Scholarships which have been forfeited will remain in the scholarship account for future awards.
